K TO SCHOO SAFELY

Learn the school bus laws and always follow them, as well as the flashing lights that school bus drivers use to alert you.

- Yellow flashing lights indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. You should slow down and prepare to stop your vehicle.
- Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. You must stop your car and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving, before you can start driving again.



Did you ever wonder what the black strips on the side of the bus were for.? They are known as rub rails and are 16 ga steel. Typically they are placed at shoulder level, seat level and floor level. The fire departments use them as guides in case of an accident.

REMEMBERING THE PAST: First Public School in Ellsworth




The pioneers were eager to build a school in the community after the building of several homes and church. So Ellsworth Public School was established and in full operation by 1900. The first public school stood on the east side of Delphi St in the 1700 block (across from the present ball diamond where two homes now set). The first public school had two parts to the two story frame building. The front part was built in 1885 and the back in 1900. These two parts were later divided and moved to DeSota St and used as homes. One part has

been torn down but the other half is still on the east side of DeSota St.

A brick Grade School house was built in 1913, facing DeSota St on the eastern portion of the same block as the earlier building. The High School building was built across the street east of the grade school in 1916. The Ellsworth Consolidated School Gymnasium was built in 1951 and was a vast improvement over the old gym. Grades K-12 were held in these locations until 1962.

The Grade School was torn down in 1975 and two homes are now on that site. The High School building and gymnasium still stand in the original area. The gym now is the Community Center with various activities held there.
